EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT TRAINING COURSE

Mercure Wellington Hotel, 345 The Terrace, Wellington 13-15 June 2017

This is a three day residential course. The aim of the course is to train Ministry of Health designated officers in aspects of civil defence and emergency management to enable them to be well prepared for any civil defence or emergency management situation where there is a risk to public health, to act with other agencies and fulfil their roles in accordance with the Emergency Management Section of the Environmental Health Protection Manual and the Ministry's National Health Emergency Plan.

Specific emphasis will be on applied learning, and some degree of knowledge by participants in the theory and practice of the Coordinated Incident Management System (CIMs) is expected.

AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE COURSE GRADUATES WILL HAVE AN APPRE-CIATION AND UNDERSTANDING OF:

- The CDEM Act, and the MoH and PHS responsibilities in civil defence and emergency management planning
- Threats to New Zealand and the public health implications of the threats
- The Coordinated Incident Management System and the application of EMIS
- What constitutes emergency management contingency planning and decision making
- Risk assessment principles
- Response planning to natural threats
- Functions of an EOC
- The role of teamwork and leadership in enabling emergency management coordination.

THE COURSE WILL INCLUDE BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO:

- Updates on National Health Emergency Management Plan and CDEM Act
- MoH policies and plans e.g. S70 Health Act
- Principles of Emergency Management
- Roles and Responsibilities of Public Health and other agencies pre and post disaster
- The structure and operation of an EOC use of Sitreps
- Contingency plans and art of risk assessment

- The Phases and Effects of Disasters Case studies
- Responses to natural threats e.g. earthquakes, tsunamis, etc

THE COURSE STRUCTURE WILL PROVIDE FOR:

- A variety of expert keynote speakers
- Syndicated workshops
- Informative lectures discussing current issues
- · Integrated networking opportunities

COURSE FEE:
