Online Training using Microsoft Teams

Manatū Hauora (Ministry of Health) has asked SMS Training to create a new training course for the purpose of training PHS staff in the concepts of Urban Development and Built Environments so they can incorporate these into their daily activities. The course will be held over three days online, running from 8.30am to around 2.30pm daily.

Whilst public health statutory officers (such as HPOs or MOoH) usually attend these type of courses, PHU managers may also want to think about making it available to policy, planning, or programme delivery staff who could also benefit from attending. Such staff may be working on urban development or built environment issues and can have an important role a working alongside public health officers to ensure that public health considerations are front of mind in local and regional level urban development and built environment work.
