- Urban Development Guidelines national policy and interagency work, what to try to influence, what changes mean for Health, potential work for DHBs.
- Environmental Noise advice in relation to RMA Review and Urban Development
- Environment Noise Assessment of Noise (understanding metrics) in relation to likely public health impacts using different settings e.g. transport, ports sea and air, industry i.e. quarries.
- Interagency Work collaborative approaches with the RMA system – case studies and application of model.
- Communications getting the public health message across to one's audience, messages and medium, planning and COVID-19 consultation, using as backdrop consider the effectiveness of the message and the medium that has been used when communicating with the general public.
- Swimming Pools Refresher NZS5826:2010
 Pool Water Quality, managing quality risks, what PHUs should investigate when risks not managed e.g. Critical Control Points.

 Key components of a pool treatment system that need to be assessed to check water quality targets are met.

- A variety of keynote speakers considered experts in their field.
- Informative lectures discussing the current topical issues
- Syndicate activities and workshops
