## **Hazardous Substances Foundation Course**

Brentwood Hotel, Wellington 4-8 December 2017

This is a 5 day residential course for Health Protection officers employed by Public Health Units. The course focus is to provide attendees with a detailed understanding of the Hazardous Substances regime. The course includes a lot of practical scenarios and exercises.

AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE COURSE GRADUATES WILL HAVE AN APPRECIATION AND UNDERSTANDING OF:

- The Act, Regulations, Gazette Notices and amendments
- Relevant agencies' responsibilities under the HSNO Act and related legislation
- Policies and implementation expectations of the Ministry of Health
- MOUs between Health and other government agencies
- EPA's expectations of enforcement agencies
- Enforcement processes and procedures
- Administrative procedures to effect compliance
- Risk management of hazardous substances
- Discussion and resolution of topical issues
- Practising application of the Act, Regulations and Gazette Notices
- Other public health activities relating to Hazardous Substances

THE COURSE WILL INCLUDE BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO:

- The HSNO Act principles and main features; roles and relationships between agencies
- Classification and minimum degrees of hazard of Hazardous Substances
- Process of controls including Group Standards
- Compliance mechanisms including Codes of Practice
- Enforcement—warranting of officers, powers of entry, inspection, offences, penalties and legal process
- Pan life-cycle controls: identification, packaging, tracking, emergency management, disposal and personnel qualifications
- Test Certification
- Emergency preparedness
- VTAs
