

Pre-course Reading and Preparation

Attendees at the course are assumed to have had a practical appreciation and situation awareness of some of the various topics that the course covers. **All attendees must have registered through ihrhrt@who.int with WHO for the On-Line Training Package and completed it and/or provided to SMS a Certificate to that effect, visited a ship and participated in a Ship Sanitation Certification assessment (either alone or with an authorised person).**

It is also required that attendees do some pre-course reading so you are prepared to participate effectively when you arrive.
